For instance, here are three persons of royalty (Magi/Wise Guys) on a mission from the area east of Jerusalem, seeking to find another "king" whose presence was marked by a visible, shining star. After consulting with Herod, they moved on to Bethlehem, the "poor" section of the neighborhood. And fol-



lowing the star, they found the one they were looking for in a very humble place in that city, worshipped Him and presented their gifts to Him. Un-be-li-veable!

What happens when you follow a star and find a stable? What happens when we often find that the result of what we were looking for turned out to be much different than what we expected?
