CONNECTED TO THE VINE

The question went something like this: "You have given your life's work to the church. Why?" I wanted to ask, "Why do you ask?" But I knew. The person wanted to know about my commitment level. Some might respond, "Because I couldn't find another line of work." That response reflects a faulty view of a call and of the Lord who calls. Others might respond, "Because I want to be able to vocalize my views." That response puts one's self over the message and ministry.



Here is what I remember saying: "I have given my life to the church, because I love the Lord Jesus, and He loves the church. What he loves I love, and what He gave His life for, I want to give my life for. There is a calling I have received from Him and I have purposed to complete it." I honestly cannot think of having spent a life of greater fulfillment any other way. God has been good and faithful, not because of what I have done, but because that is who He is. Spending my life being attached or connected to the Vine has been deepest satisfaction.

Jesus said that those who abide or dwell in Him will be ones who become fruitful and productive (John 15:5). It is interesting to observe that there are two connections we have in the church; one connection is with each other (the church or the branches) and the other is with our Lord (the True Vine). The branches and the fruit derive their source in the Vine. Becoming fruitful and productive Christ followers depends on our connection to the Vine. Our fellowship and encouragement depends on our connection with each other.

Next month (July 20-23) we are going to explore this Vine Connection at the annual EFC-MAYM Ministry Conference and meetings. We will be sending you more information about what is planned for training, equipping, "connecting", growing, eating, sleeping, and blessing. Be sure to mark your calendar and plan to come to the campus of Friends University for this special time.

The Design Your Impact workshop is a five-hour, fast-moving interactive experience. Six video stories illustrate how very different types and sizes of churches have selected and successfully launched a strategic missions focus ('spiritually own' or 'adopting a mission') based on the unique vision and resources God has given them. NINE MYTHS ABOUT CHURCH PLANTING

MYTH #2 : Planting hurts existing churches. FACTS:

- New churches set new standards and raise the quality of ministry in a community.
- Planting helps existing churches recapture their Missional heart and edge.
- New churches seek to reach the unchurched. In most communities this is well over half the population. Many more new churches are needed to reach them.
- Statistics show that within our region only 17.8% of the population regularly attends church.
- New churches often reach different age, ethnic, or socioeconomic groups.
