I believe that the Lord led me to what our focus as a church for 2011 should be: "Taking the Land". We took it as a challenge from the Lord to move boldly ahead in advancing the Kingdom of God. Shortly after that revelation, two amazing things happened.

First, the Lord raised up a group of people from our church who have a vision to reach a small town called Oyster Creek (pop. 1,300). This is a rough town with only two little churches, neither well attended. We began prayer walks, looking for a place to open a ministry. Nothing was available. We kept praying. An abandoned Laundromat came up for sale, and we negotiated a price. Now we now have a property in Oyster Creek. We are remodeling the building and should have it operational this spring. We are claiming this city for the Kingdom of God.

Second, our building committee has been working on expanding our church building, but nothing seemed to be coming together right. One of the committee members mentioned our expansion plans to a local land developer. The developer mentioned that instead of expanding we probably needed to move to a better location. He approached his group and mentioned our situation. The group decided to donate 6.4 acres of prime land (the kind that sells by the square foot!) to our church. We now have a prime location, just a half mile from the new Angleton High School campus.

Okay, Lord, you have given us "land", now please give us the faith, obedience and strength to "take it"! This means that we will have to recapture the focus of the early Friends, who are described as a "movement" and not particularly a "church." A movement moves...

#### #4 MYTH: Planting usually fails. FACTS:

- The Bad News: Some estimates say that 4 out of 5 new churches will fail and only 1 in 10 sustain at larger than 100 people in worship.
- The Good News: The success rates increase dramatically when the new church takes advantage of training and coaching from experienced church planters.
- Mid America Friends propagates "well-conceived projects" in church planting, which includes assessing church planter pastors, providing training to planting pastor and team, utilizing a qualified coach, and starting with appropriate parent church partnerships for support in early years.
- The success rate of planting well-conceived projects in the Evangelical Covenant Church after 4 years is 86%.
