

REFLECTIONS ON 'NEW' THINGS

Our daily paper contains advertising inserts for the "Greatest Sale Ever" and when you look at them, it seems like the same stuff, at the same price, week after week. Nothing new



I get emails from "friends" telling me that if I don't forward it to at least 10 people, the wrath of God will strike me - or something like that. Nothing new there.

I hear the same complaints about church: the music was too loud, the pastor was too boring, the hymns were too slow, the announcements were too long, and on and on. Nothing new there.

Is the writer of Ecclesiastes correct when he says, "there is nothing new under the sun"? Do we go through the same old routines in the same way, hearing the same things and feeling the same ways? Is there really nothing new?

But then I read notes from missionaries about how Hindus and Muslims are coming to Christ, how new churches are springing up, people being delivered and healed. And then I hear from our churches about people being called to plant new churches and about some people in the church being called to live missional and incarnational lifestyles to bring people to Christ. I see a new enthusiasm springing up among the Evangelical Friends of Mid America about planting churches, and how our churches are committing to support these new churches. It looks like something new may be springing up.

Perhaps the Lord has a message for us; the one He gave to Isaiah: "See, I am doing a new thing! Now it springs up; do you not perceive it? I am making a way in the wilderness and streams in the wasteland" (Isa 43:19). Just when you feel like you are stuck in the rut of sameness, wandering in the wilderness and thirsting in the wasteland, God has a message for us. There is something new after all. What a great time to be alive!

MYTH #1: PLANTING WILL HURT THE PARENT CHURCH.

FACTS:

- Seldom true in fact, most parenting churches find a new season of vitality after parenting.
- God honors the giving, brings in new leaders, and raises up those who have been waiting for an opportunity to serve.
- We are blessed when we are a blessing.
- Statistics show that churches that plant grow 3 times faster than those who don't.

Remember that churches successfully plant churches (rather than yearly meetings planting churches)! This is adapted from an article recently published by the Evangelical Covenant Church of America. - The Grand Opening of Friendly Grounds, a new missional ministry outreach center, in Oyster Creek, TX will be held on October 1, 2011. Their aim to is to take the gospel outside the reach of those of the conventional church.

- David Byrne is working closely with the new Hispanic plant in San Antonio, TX. With the closest Friends Churches in the Houston area, mobilizing a PAT is more difficult. However, it is possible for churches to partner with a new plant, even when geographically removed.
